Survey Results

Performed by Spry Strategies

The Women's Services National Survey was conducted by IVR and Online Mobile Interviews from June 3- June 8 among a random sample of 3000 likely and newly registered voters. The survey has a margin of error of +/- 1.8 percentage points. Results are weighted. Some percentages in crosstab reports for this poll may not add to 100% due to rounding. Interviews were geographically dispersed across the county to reflect the nation's electorate.

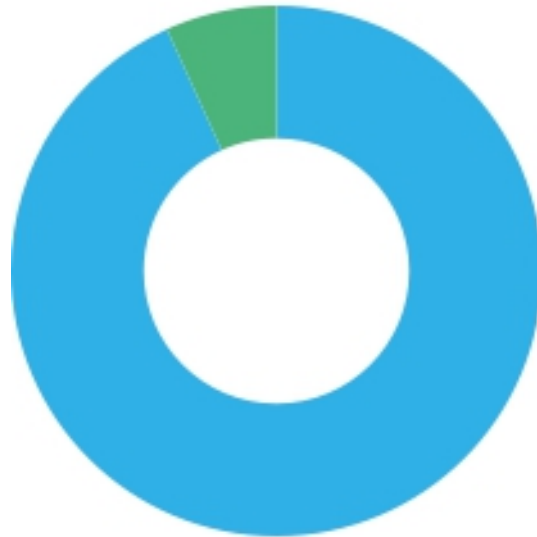

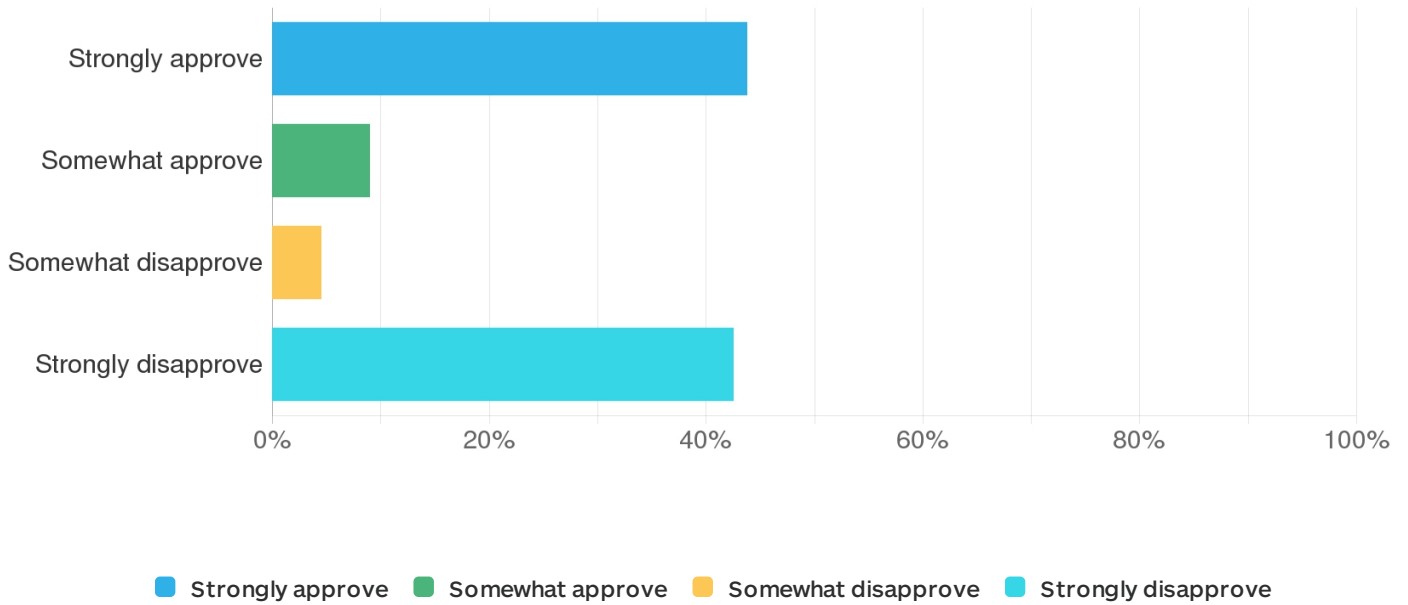

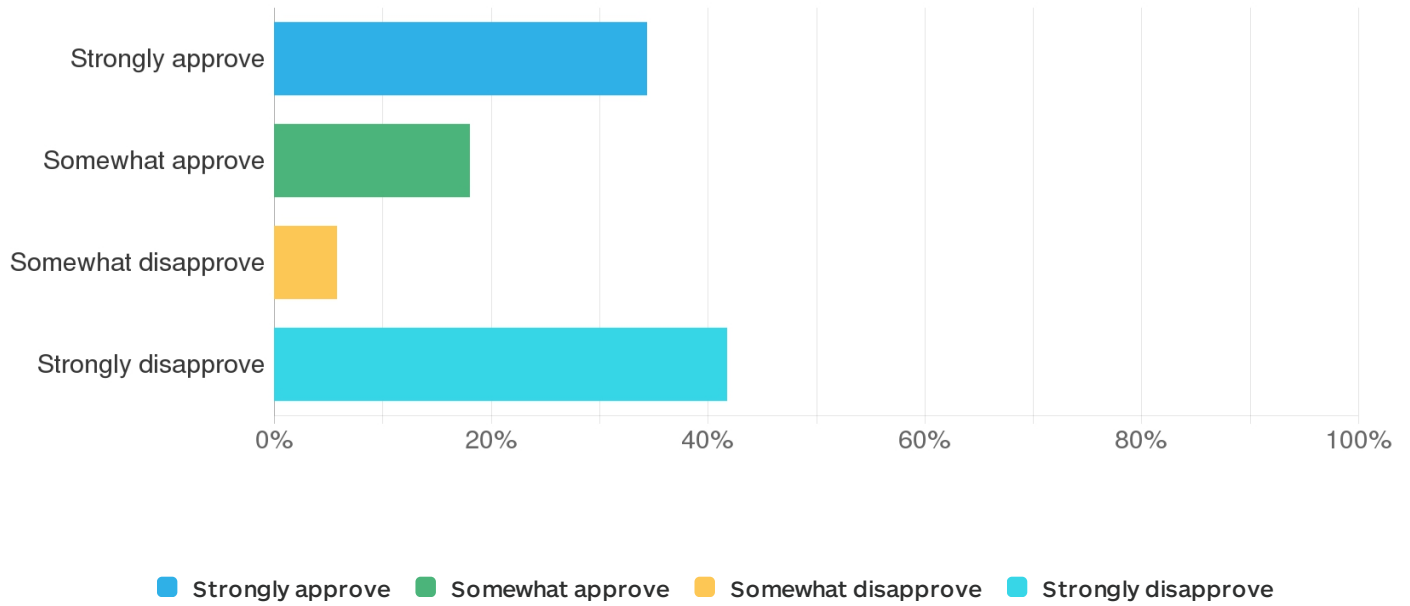

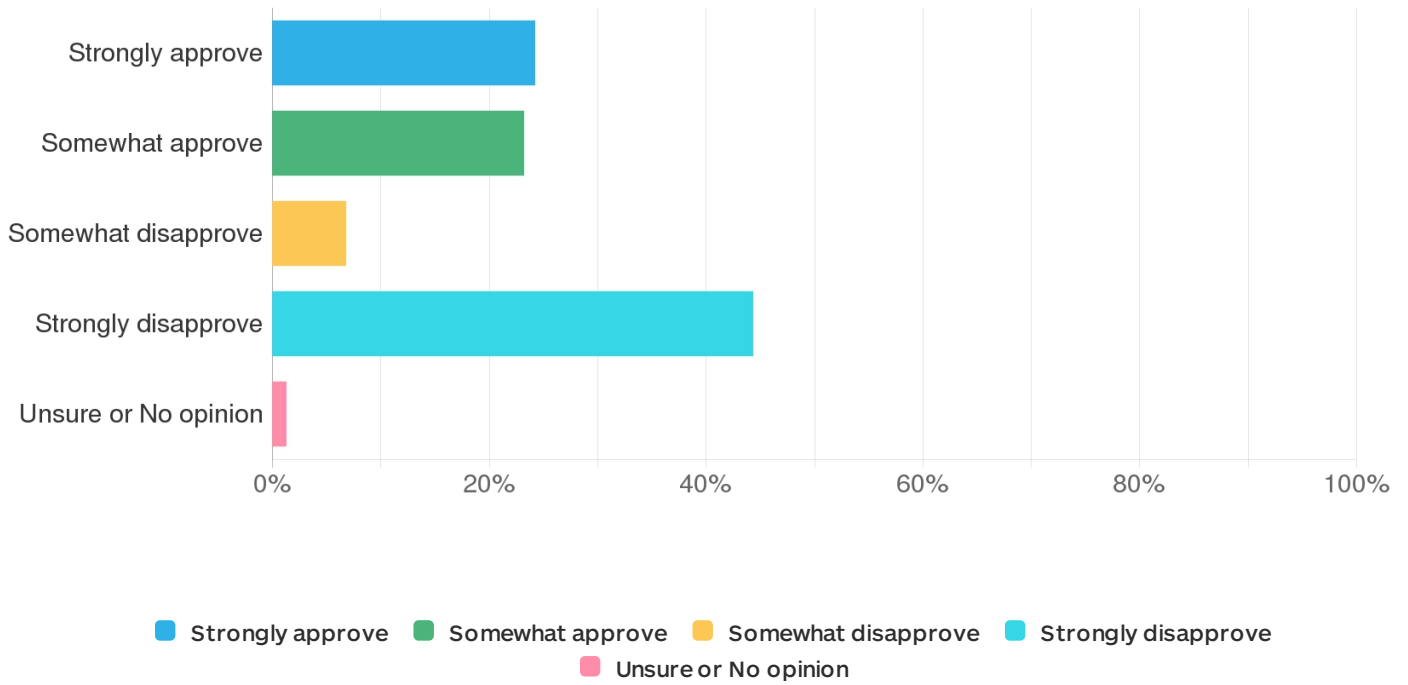

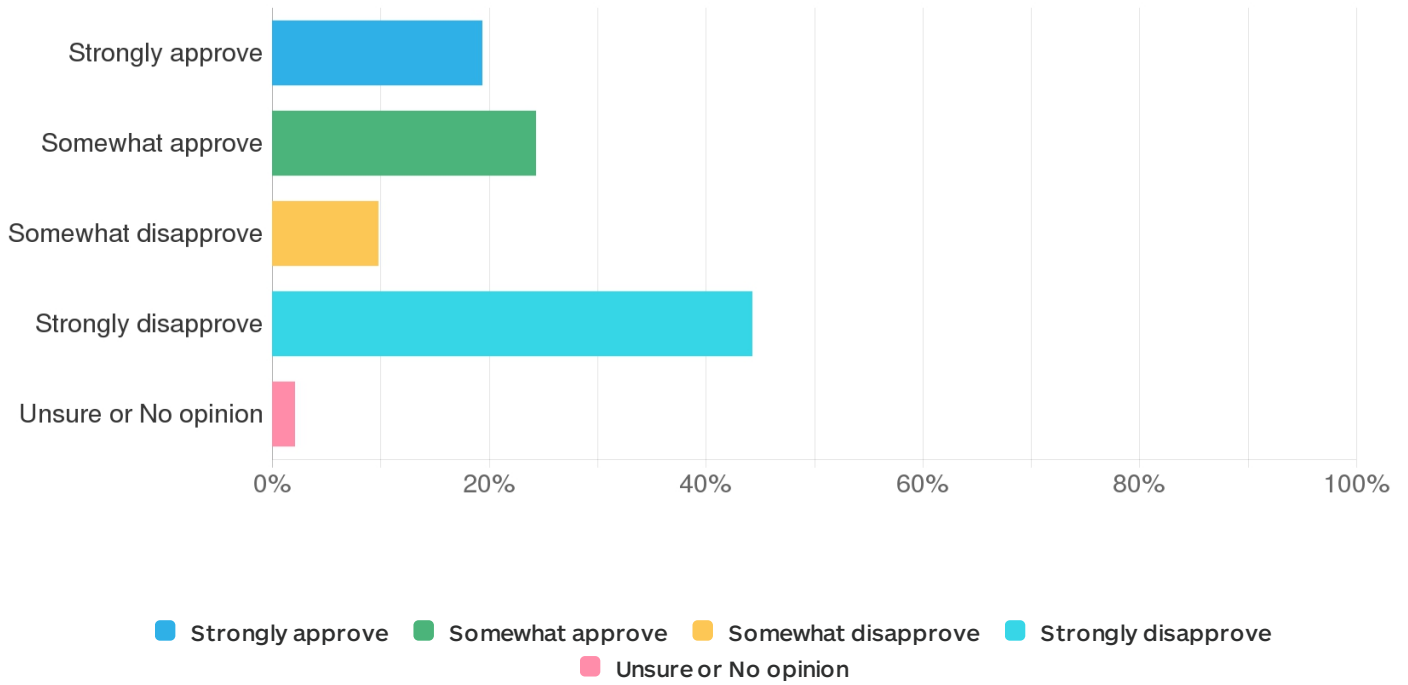

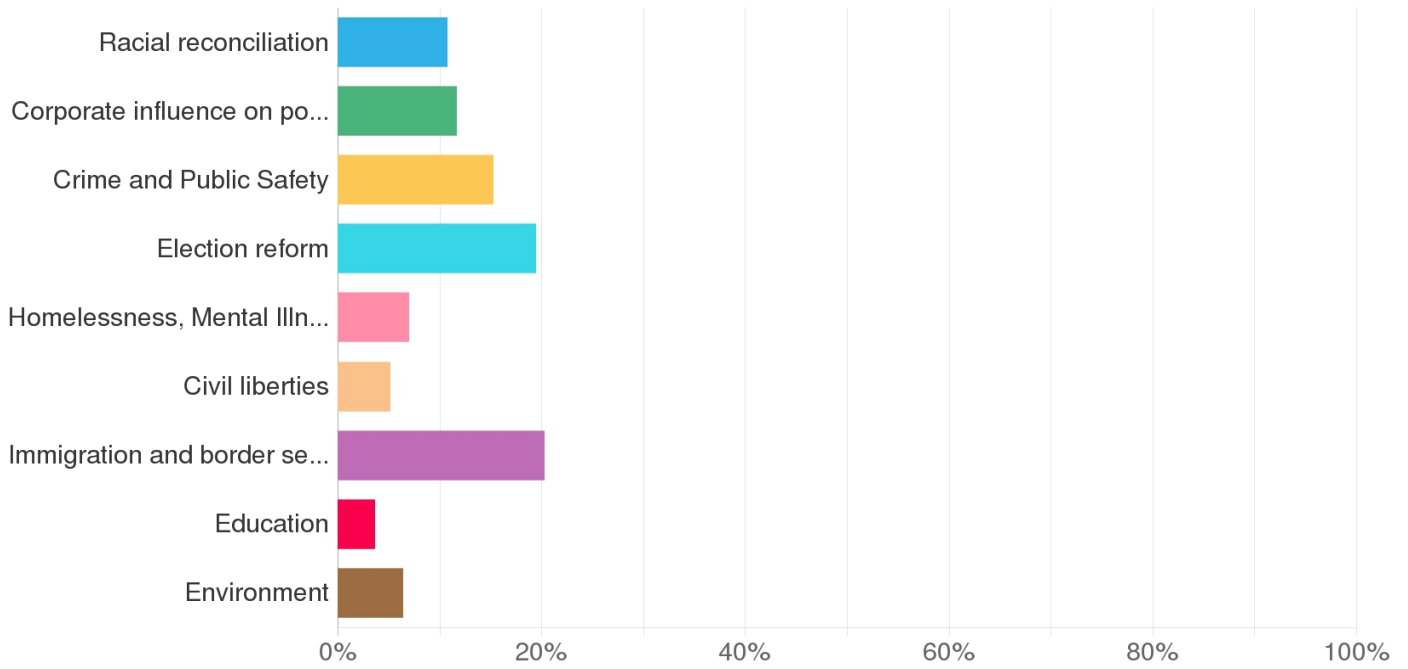

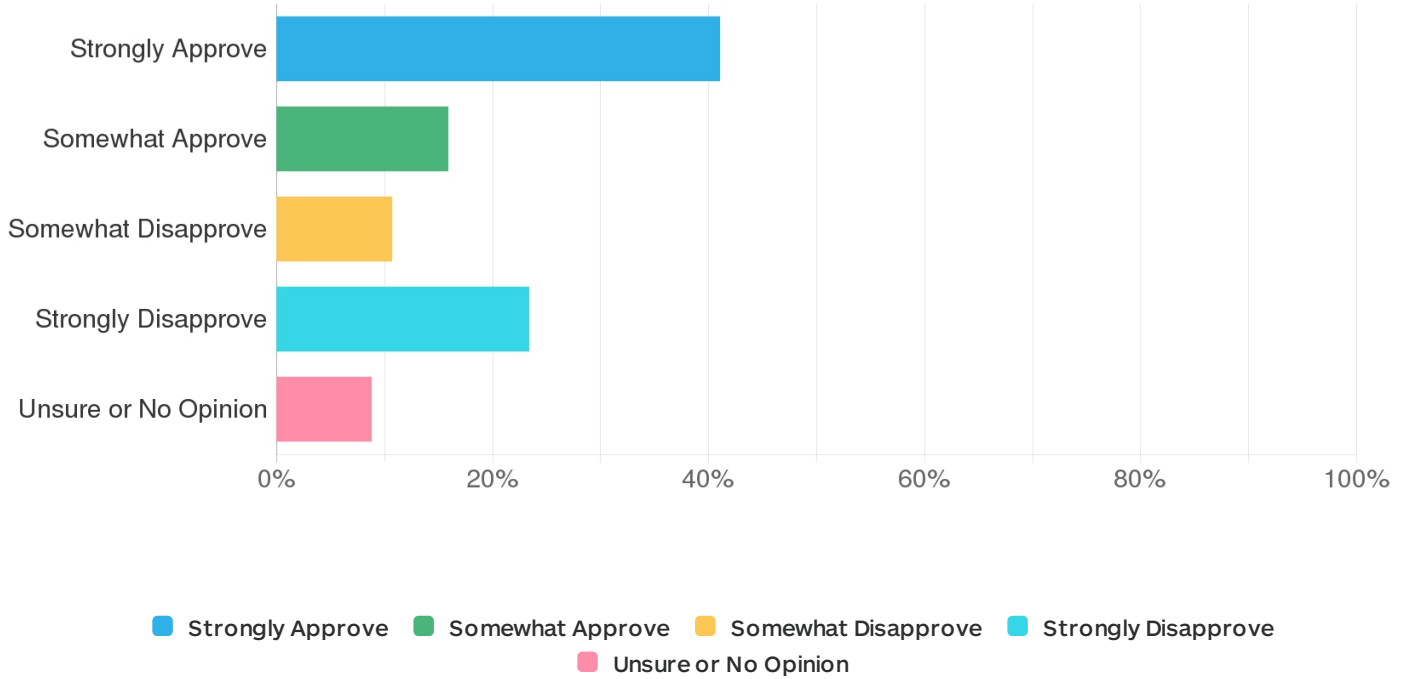

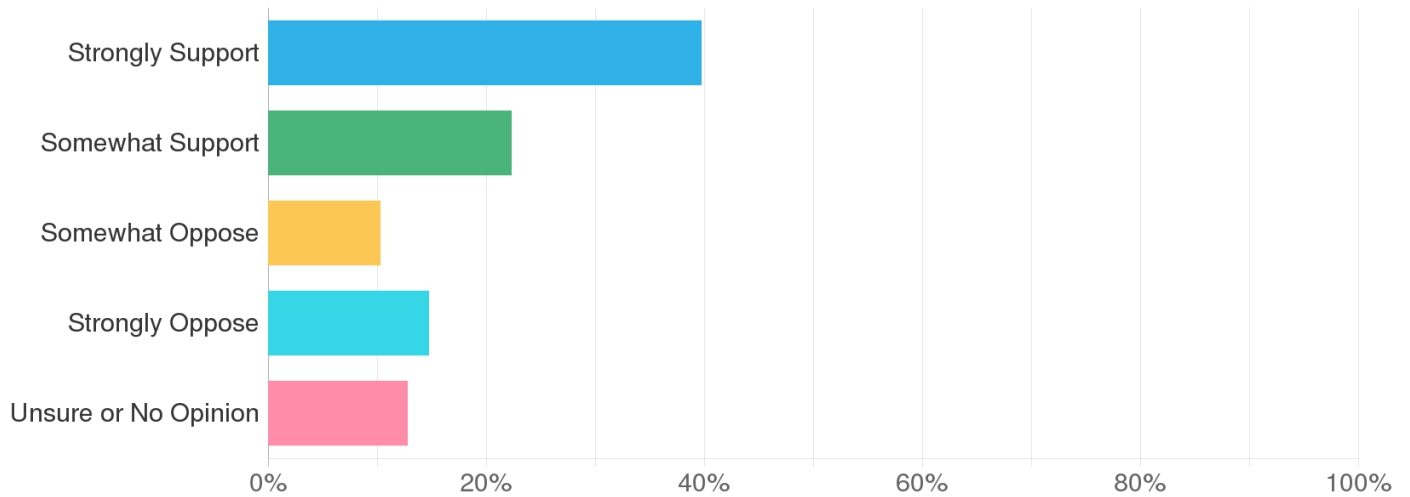

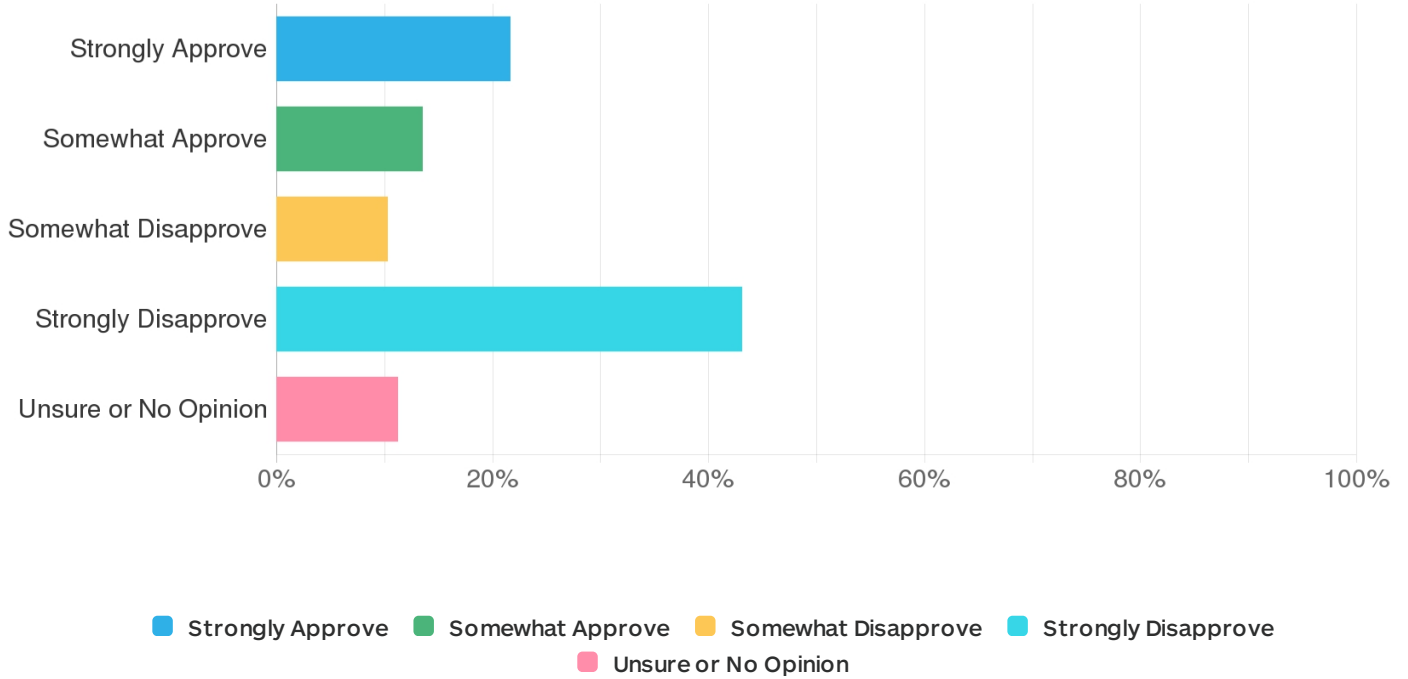

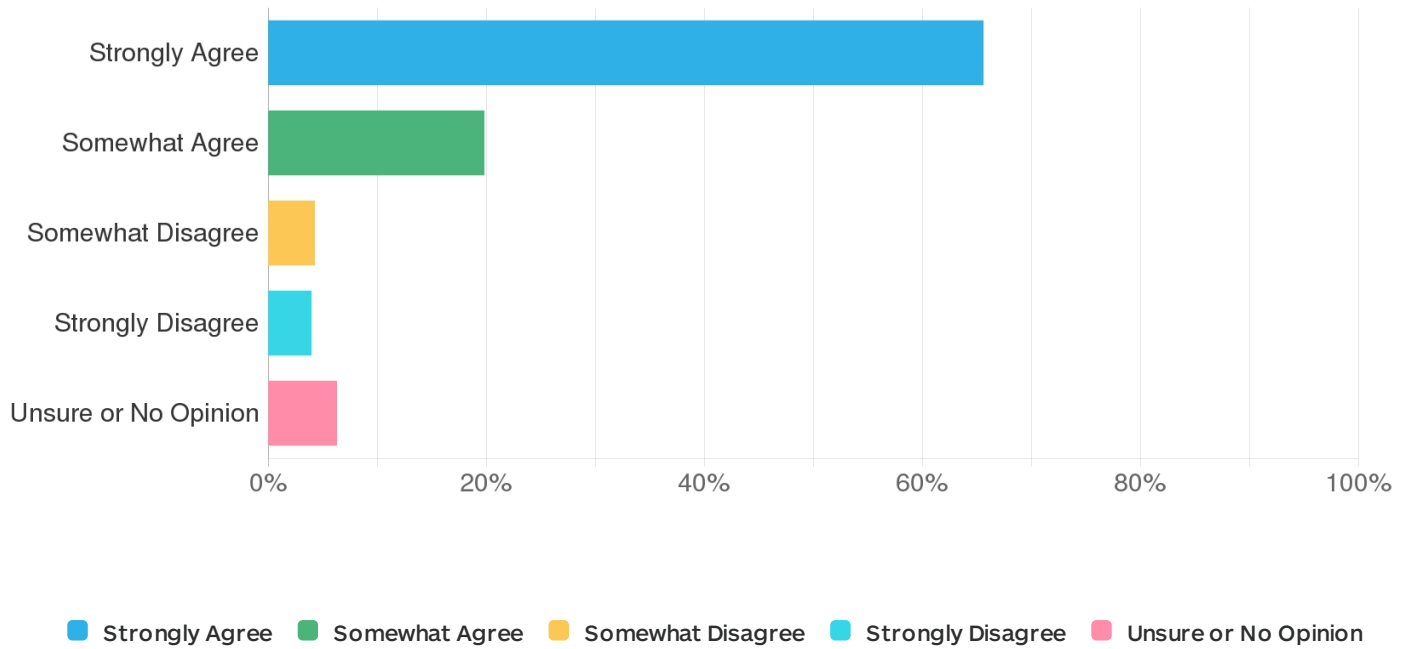

Do you believe that employees should generally be allowed to express spiritual or personal convictions outside of the workplace without getting fired?

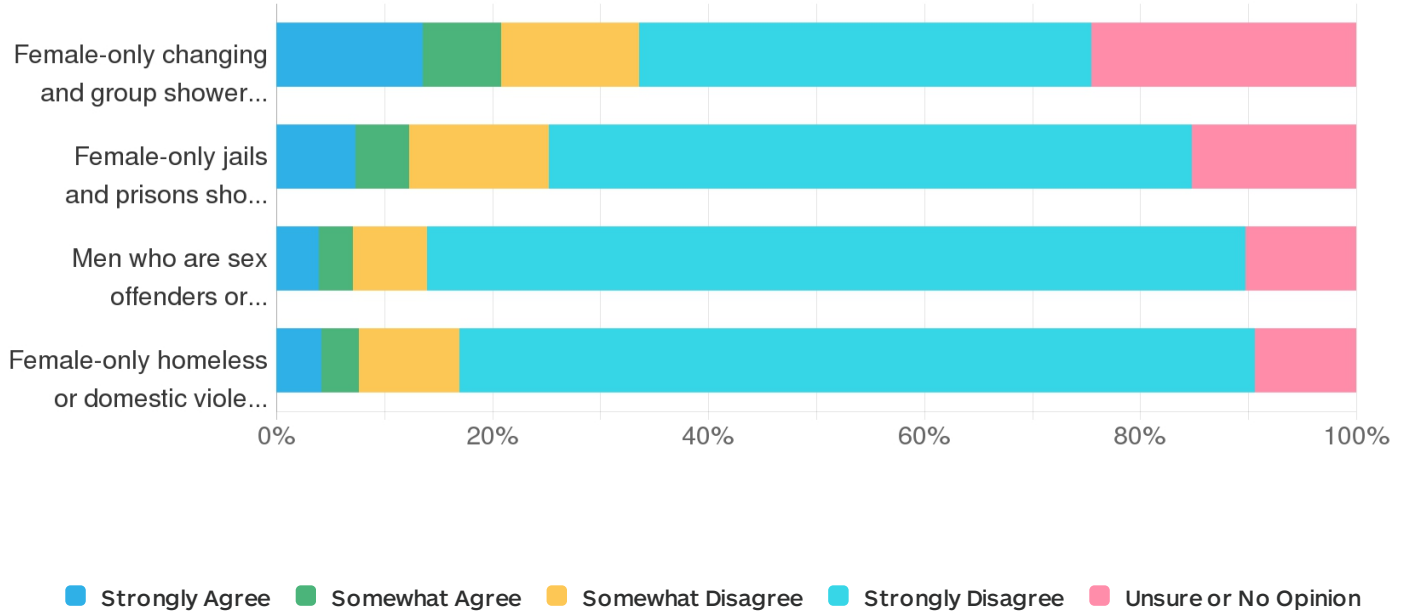

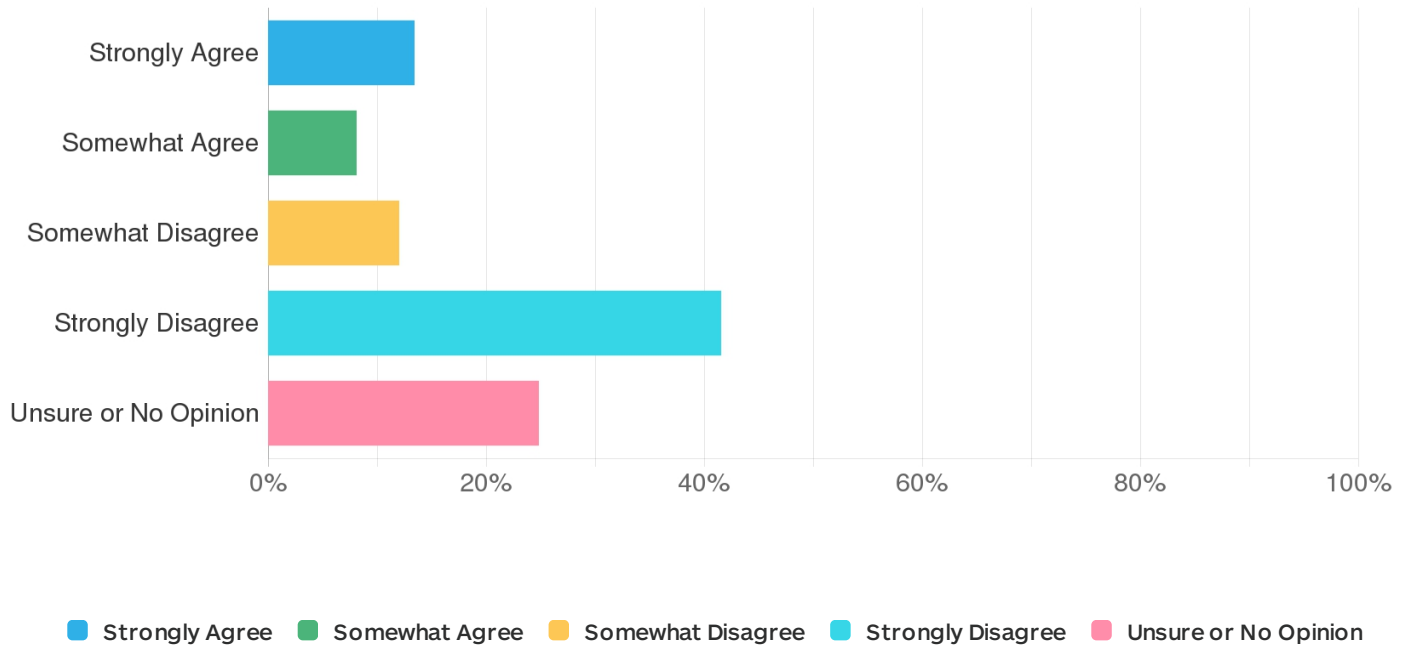

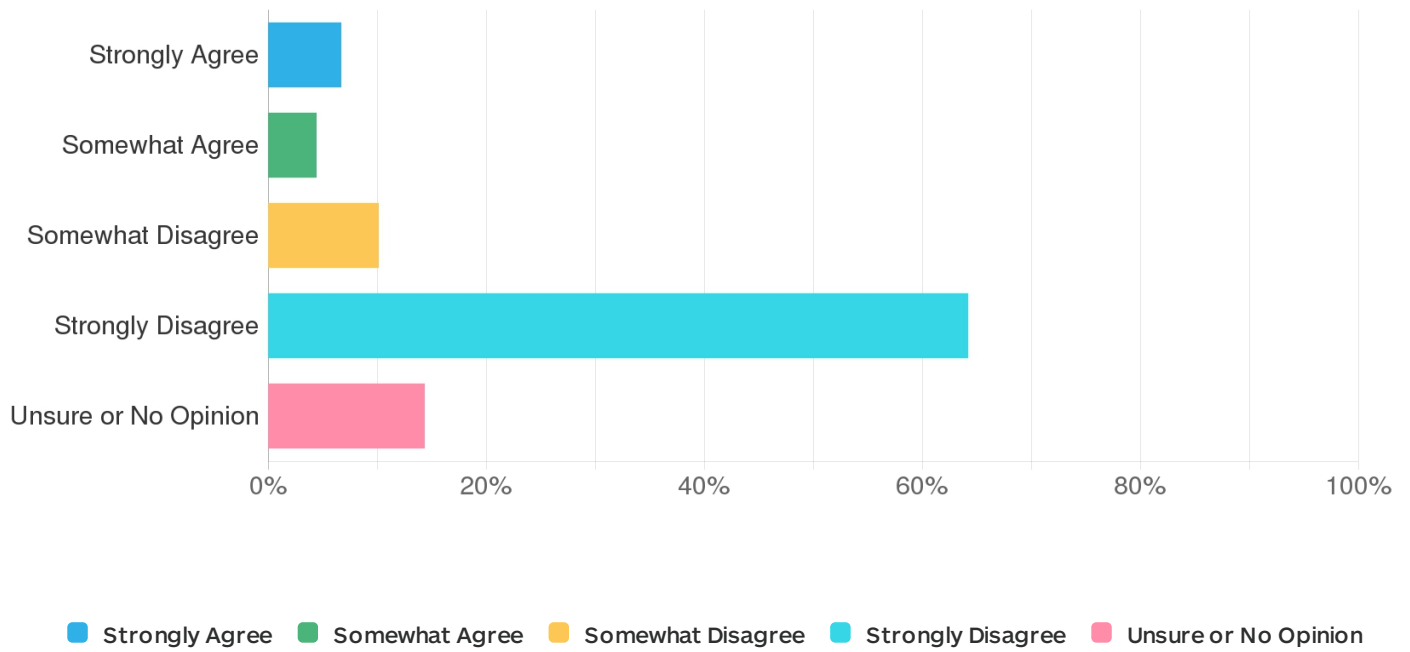

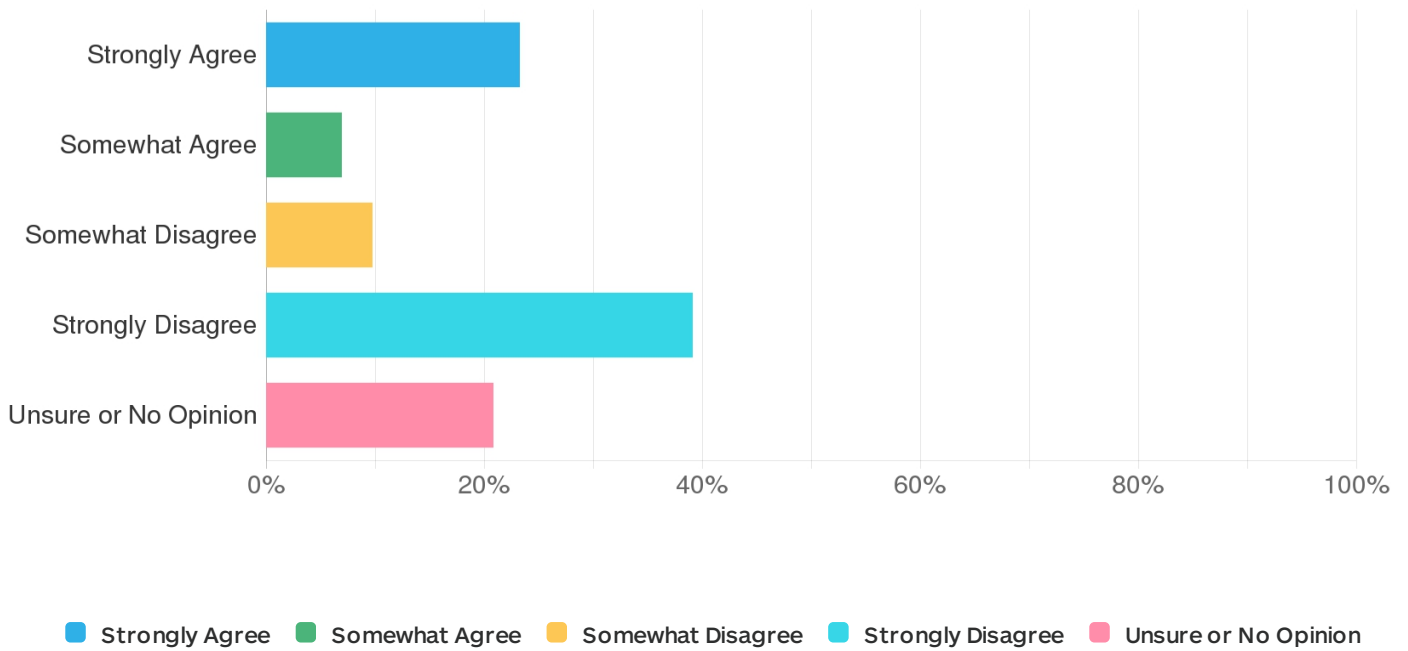

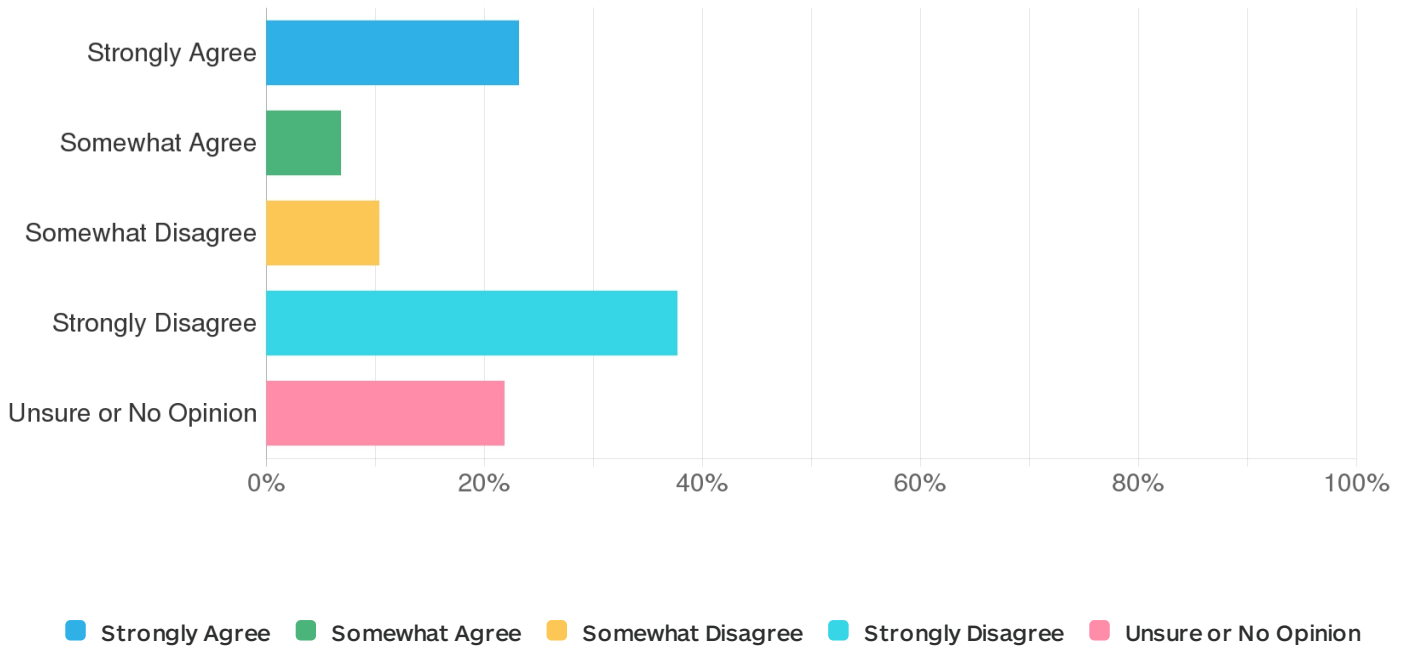

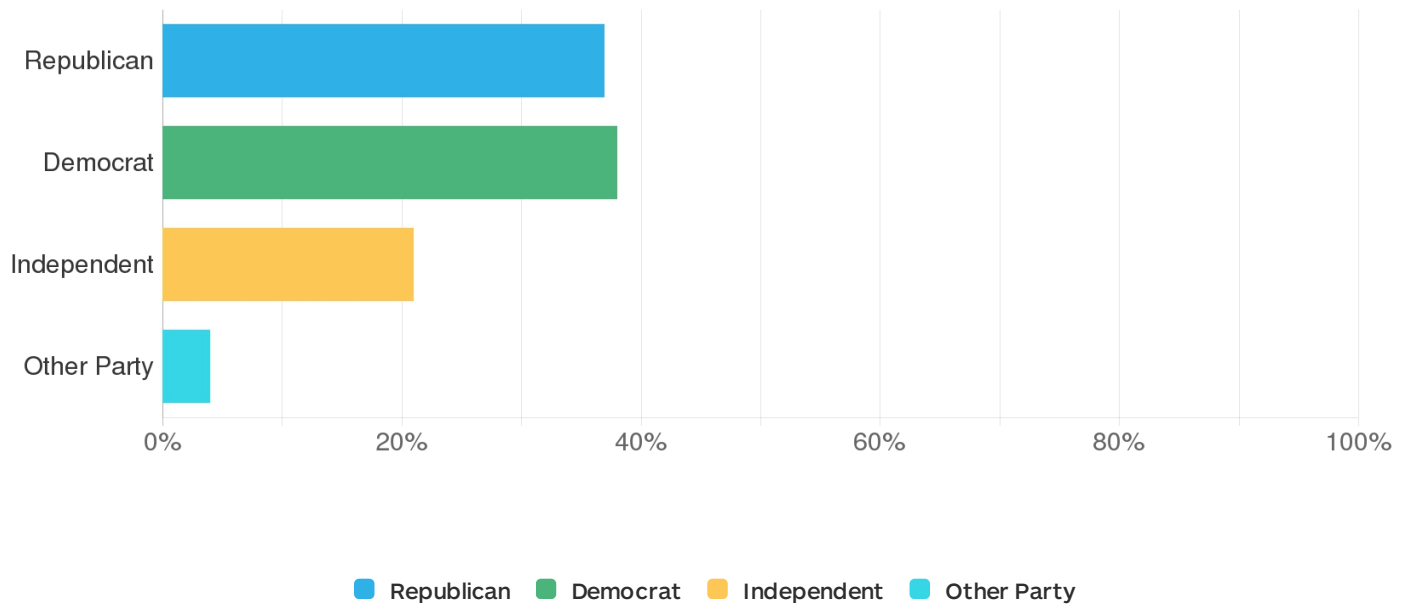

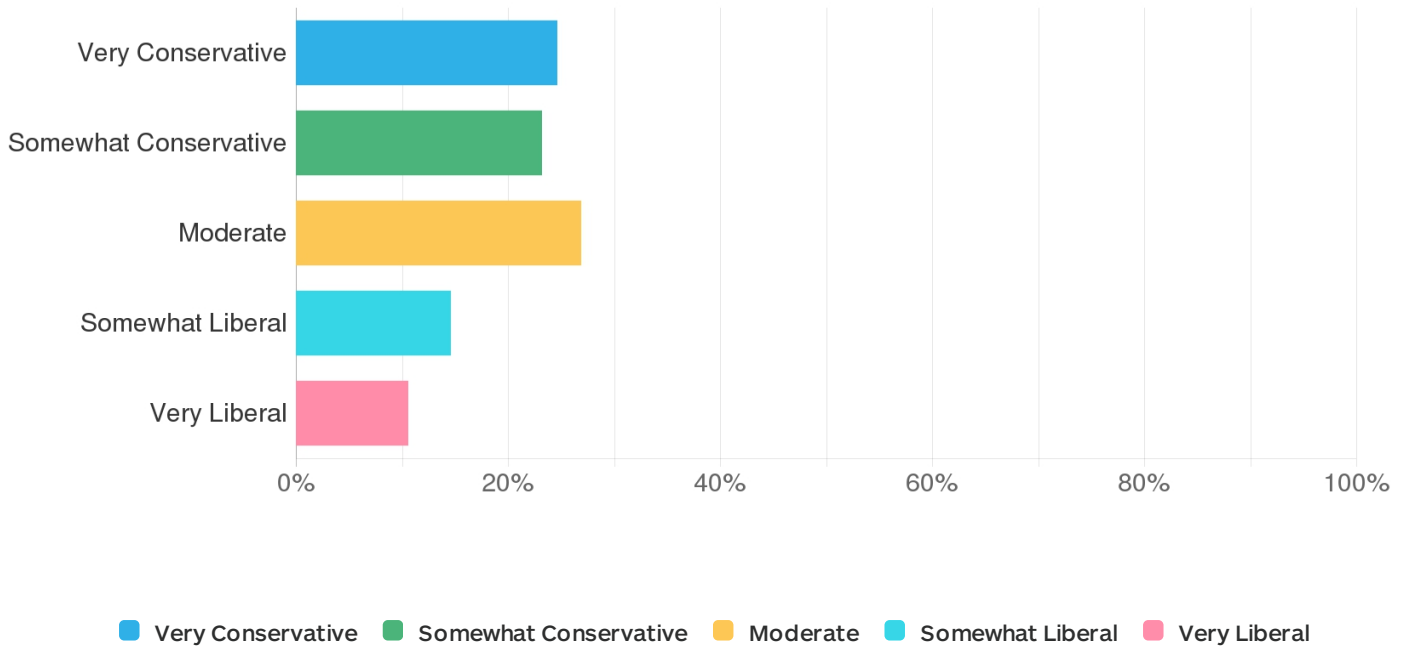

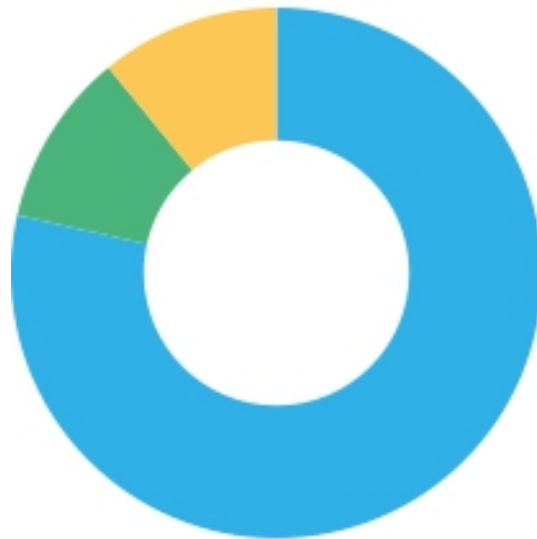

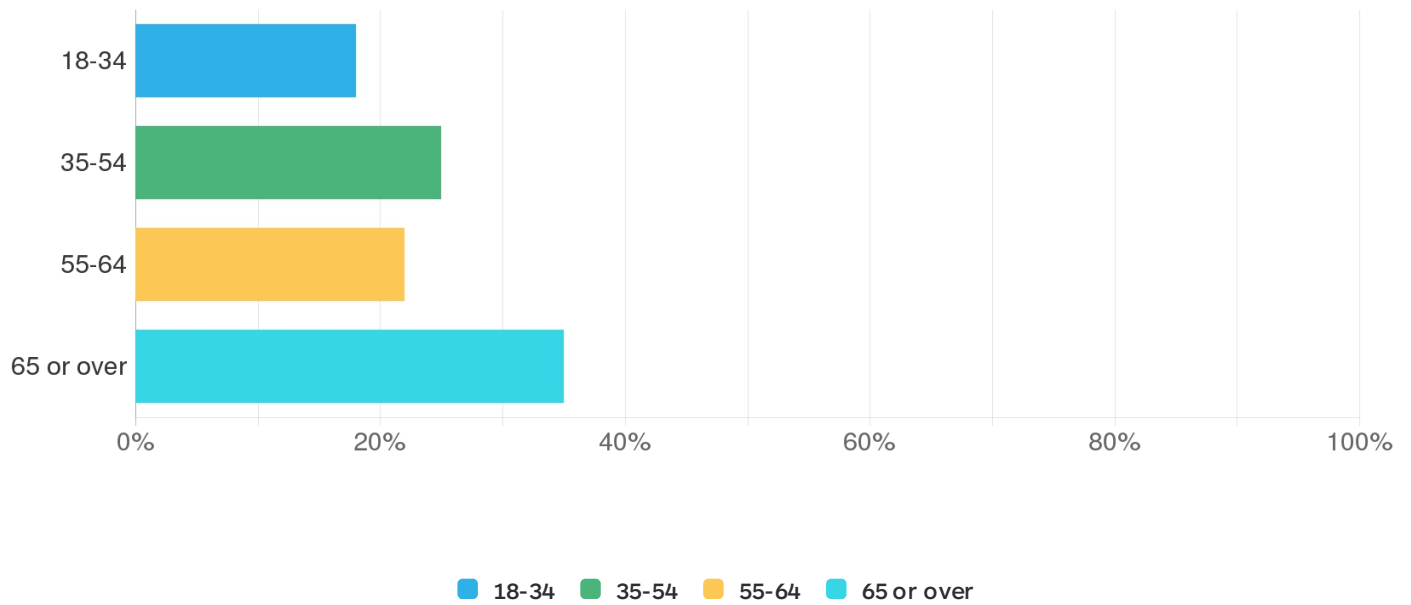

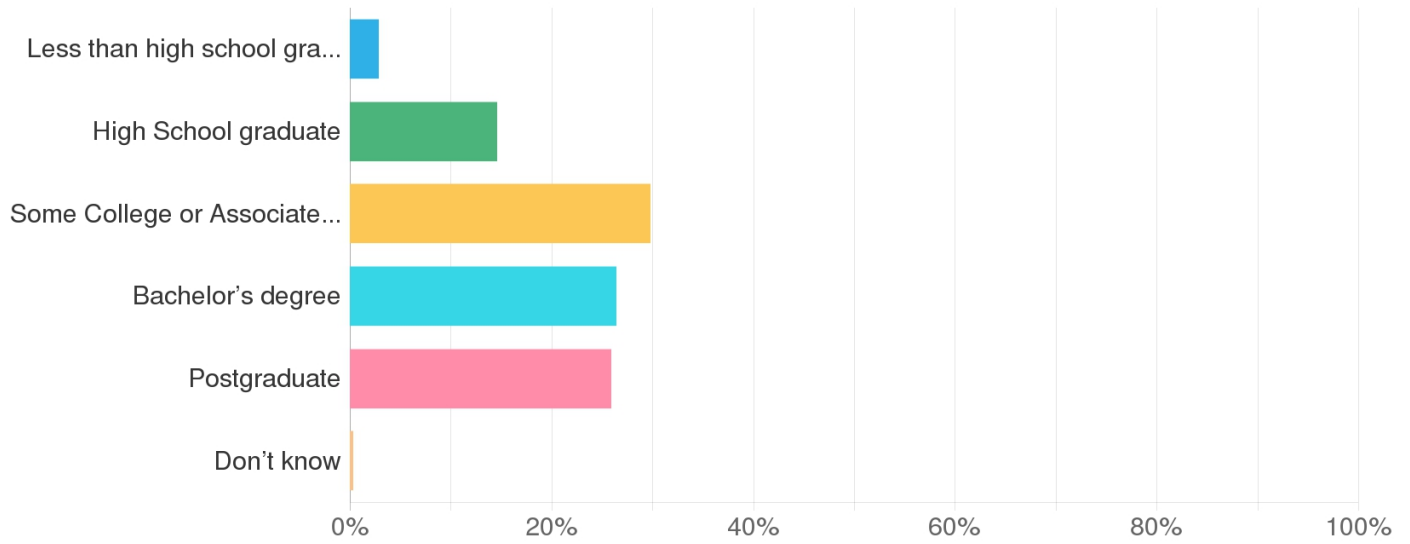

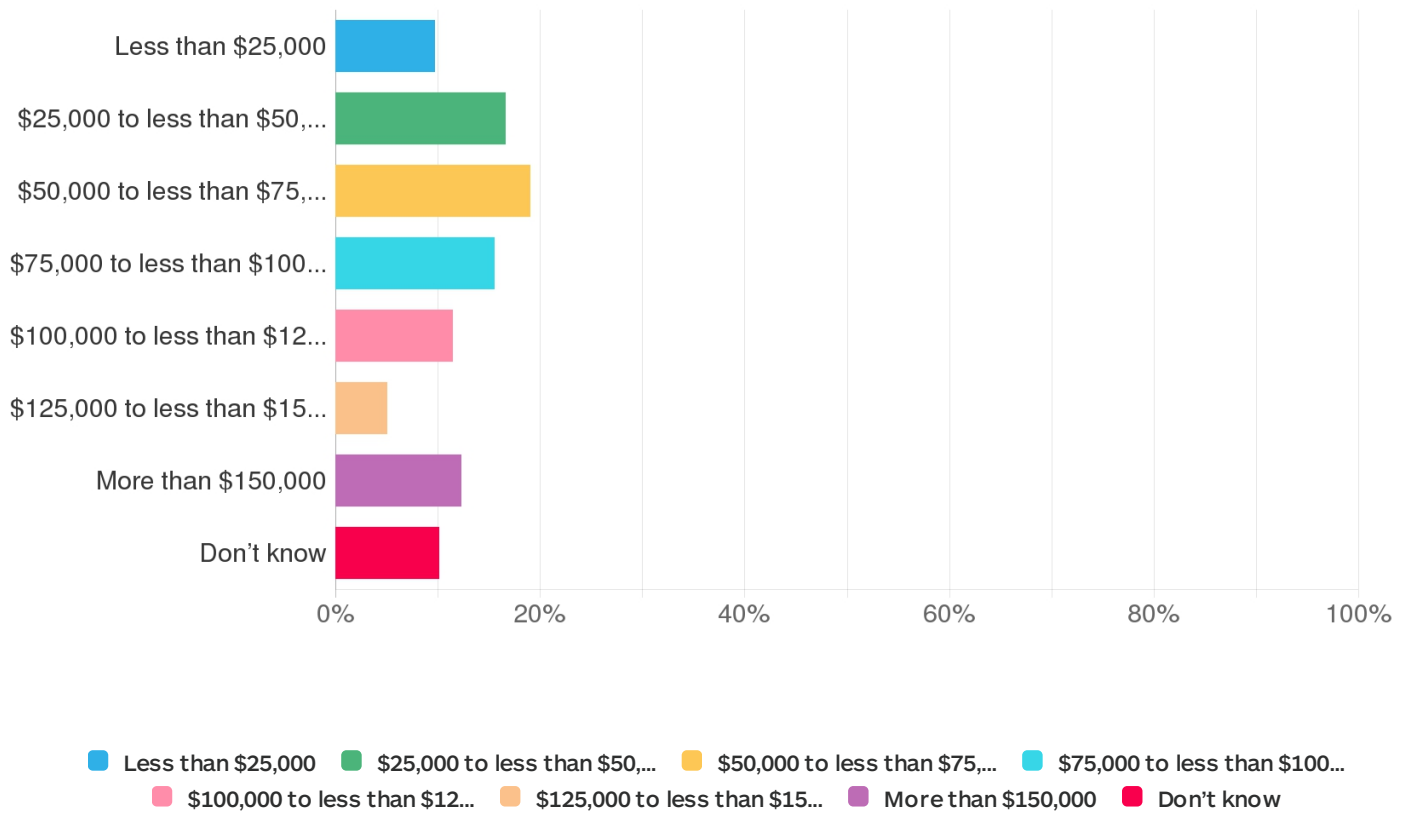

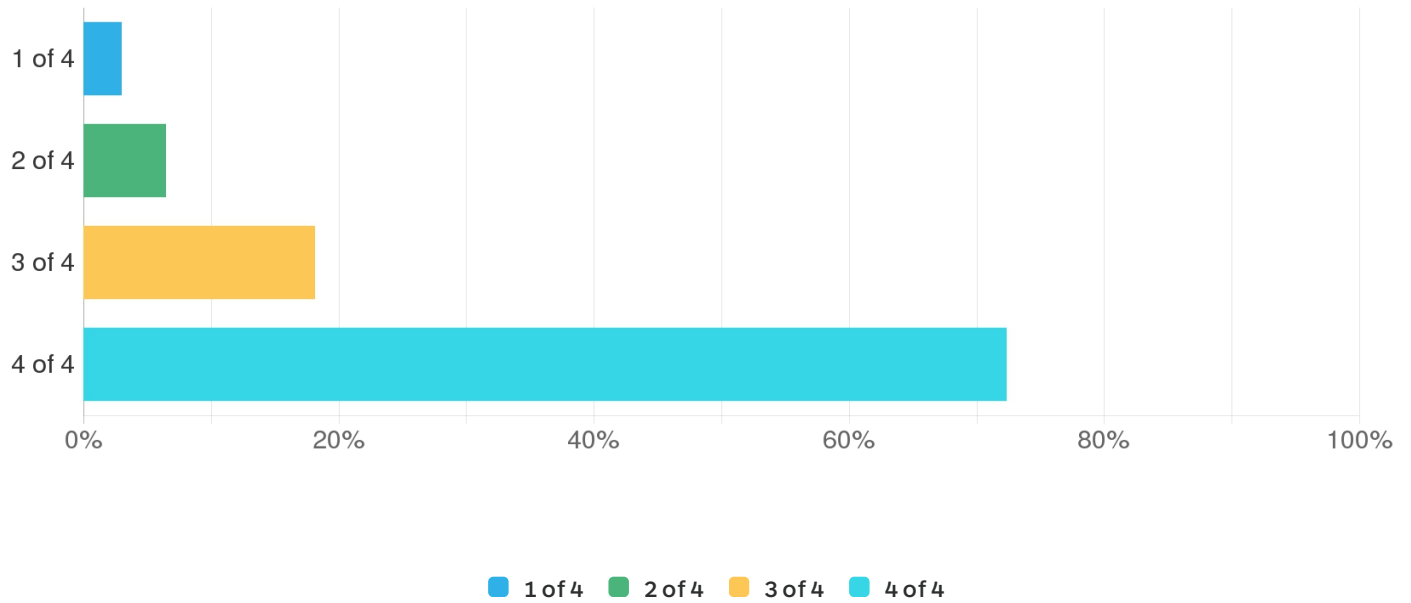

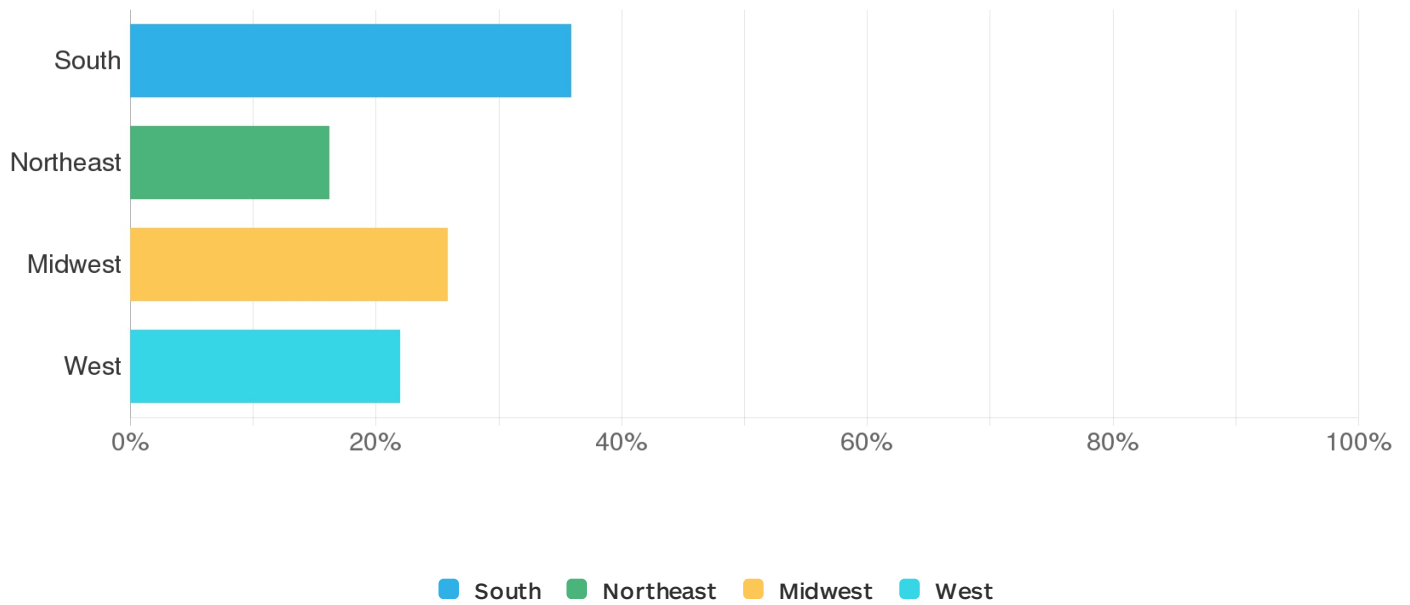
